STUDENT HIGHLIGHT THE EDDIE FORDHAM ACT

Eddie Fordham, a Jack Kent Cooke Scholar, founder of the Justice-Impacted Student Organization (JISO), and a powerhouse advocating for change in Florida's carceral landscape, recently made waves at Florida State University (FSU), after a bill named after him was passed in the FSU Student Government Association (SGA), which made it so that individuals with a felony conviction can serve on SGA.

During an interview with FSView, Eddie stated "This [bill] is a major first step so that those who have lived experience or firsthand knowledge of what it's like to either be impacted themselves or in a family that's been impacted now have a voice at the table and can bring their diversity to the unity that this Senate represents..."

TEACHER'S EXPERIENCE UWF'S INSIDE OUT PRISON-EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Dr. Nicole Niebuhr and Dr. Jennifer Brinkley brought an Inside-Out Prison Exchange Program course to the University of West Florida (UWF) in Spring 2022. It was also taught in 2024 and will be taught in Spring 2026. UWF students are taken into Santa Rosa Correctional Institution each week to have a class with incarcerated men.

The course is designated as a High Impact Practices (HIP) course and is funded through a HIP grant. The course concludes with group project poster presentations where a criminal justice policy is presented. A closing ceremony is held where students receive certificates of completion along with a keepsake book with their written letters to future students.

A former student stated, "The importance of this class extends beyond education." Another said, "It's a privilege to be able to learn about and hear about these kinds of issues from the people who are living them every day."
