Bachelor of Arts in Bassoon Performance

- 1. Two movements of a standard concerto or sonata, or solo work for bassoon (Applicants my choose works by Telemann, Vivaldi, Mozart, Devienne, Weber, Hummel, Bourdeau, Hurlstone, and others. Unaccompanied works such as Adolphus Hailstork's *Bassoon Set* or Jenni Brandon's *Color Stones* are also acceptable. Applicants may also select one etude from *Concert Studies* by Ludwig Milde, *Scale & Arpeggio Studies*, and/or a more advanced portion of the *Weissenborn Studies* or Jancourt.)
- 2. Students will be asked to play major scales and a full range chromatic scale.
- 3. Sigh-treading will may be included in the audition.

Piano accompaniment is not required for undergraduate auditions.

Transfer students:

Level II Placement

To be considered for placement in Level II of applied bassoon, transfer students must have completed significant performance work at the college Level I and demonstrate solid performance skills. Applicants should be able to play all major and minor scales across the full range of the instrument.

Level III Placement:

To be considered for placement in Level III of applied bassoon, transfer students must have completed significant performance work at college Levels I and II. Applicants should be able to play all major and minor scales across the full range of the instrument.

GRADUATE STUDIES

Master of Arts in Bassoon Performance

- 1. Two contrasting solo works from the standard repertory (Applicants include
- Mozart, Saint-Saëns, Tansman, Telemann, Vivaldi and others)
- 2. One etude from Milde's Concert Studies, Op. 26
- 3. Three standard orchestral excerpts

Piano accompaniment is not required for graduate auditions.
