Department of History

Undergraduate Degree Requirements

In order to graduate from UCF with a BA in History, you must complete 36 semester hours of history courses with a grade of a "C" or better.

A maximum of 18 hours of history courses may be accepted from transfer institutions upon approval of the department chair.

All majors must:

- Complete twenty-one (21) semester hours of upper division (3000 level and above) history courses with at least six (6) hours in any three (3) of the following four geographic regions:
 - US and Canada (AMH)
 - Asia, Africa, and Middle Eastern (ASH or AFH)
 - British and European (EUH)
 - Latin America (LAH)
- Complete HIS 4150 (History and Historians) - 3hrs.
- Submit a final portfolio of 8-12 graded works
 - This will include representative samples of student's written work included but not limited to: book reviews, in-class exams, and research papers.
- Meet the following GPA requirements:
 - minimum 2.0 GPA in all completed courses
 - minimum 2.0 GPA in all courses taken at UCF
 - minimum 2.0 GPA in all history courses
- Meet the following university exit requirements:
 - minimum of 120 semester hours
 - minimum 48* semester hours in 3000 level courses or higher
 - the last 30 semester hours must be completed at UCF for residency requirement
- Complete two (2) semesters of one foreign language.
 - These two semesters may have been taken at a transfer institution or may be taken upon entering UCF. This requirement may also be met by passing a language proficiency test at UCF.
 - Majors who are contemplating graduate school should complete three semesters of a foreign language, preferable one functional in their area of historical interest.

• JST3144 The Dead Sea Scrolls	counts as ASH
• JST 3424 Biblical Archaeology	counts as ASH
• JST 3450 Modern Jewish Experience	counts as AMH, ASH, or EUH

Other History Course Conversions

The following upper-level courses can convert to ASH, AMH, EUH, or LAH courses:

- World History (WOH)
- General History (HIS)

Examples:

HIS3462: History of Science can count as EUH if needed

HIS4323: History of the Future can count as AMH or EUH if needed

WOH4272: Age of Atlantic Revolutions 1763-1826 can count as AMH, EUH, or LAH if needed

WOH4430: Privacy and Maritime Law can count as AMH, EUH, or LAH if needed

WOH4208: History of Global Drug Trade can count as AMH, EUH, or LAH if needed

CONDUCT UNDERGRAD RESEARCH & PRESENT AT CONFERENCES!

The Honors Undergraduate Thesis (HUT) Program, is designed to encourage the best juniors and seniors to undertake original and independent work in their major field.

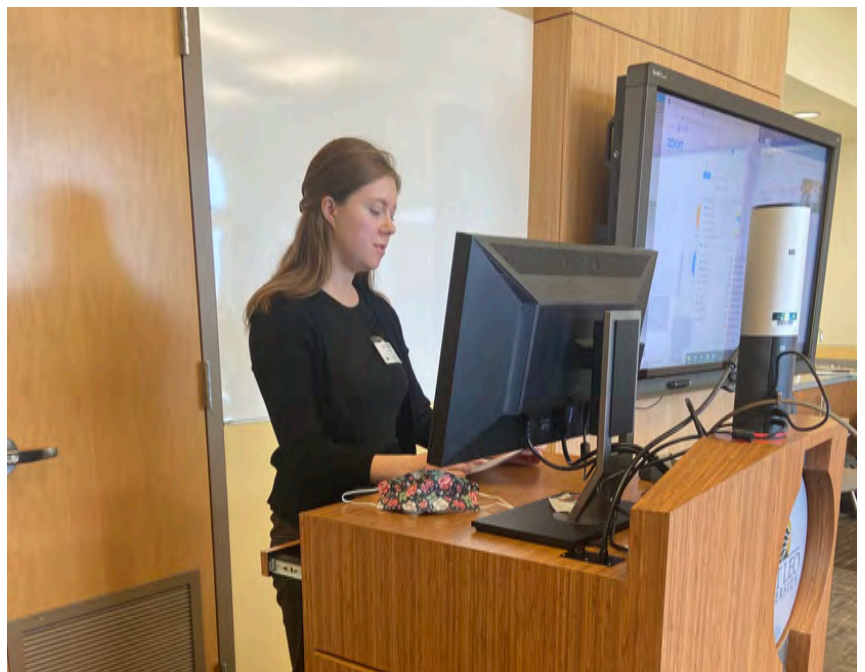
Established in 1989, Honors in the Major is the oldest and most prestigious undergraduate research program at UCF. It is the only undergraduate research program on campus in which students are required to undertake original and innovative research as principal investigators

At a minimum, the following criteria must be met for admission into the Honors Undergraduate Thesis program:

- Sixty (60) completed hours of college credit
- Twelve (12) completed upper division hours
- At least a 3.4 UCF GPA or Overall GPA
- At least two semesters remaining prior to graduation

ACCELERATED UNDERGRAD/ GRAD PROGRAM

Are you interested in pursing a graduate degree in history?

The History department offers an accelerated Undergraduate to Graduate program to allow undergrads to take graduate level courses that will count towards their master's degree while completing their Bachelors Degree.

Admission Requirements

- Apply for admission toward the end of your Junior year
- Must have 12 hours of upper-level history coursework
- 3.5 GPA or better in history courses
- 3.25 overall GPA
- A substantial academic writing sample between 2000 and 5000 words illustrating the applicant's ability to engage in historical research and analysis. Acceptable writing samples may include a chapter from an honors thesis, a conference paper, or a term paper.
- Completion of Graduate Application, including essay indicating reasons for desiring to complete the accelerated program
- Three letters of recommendation from History Department faculty
