

VIOLA AUDITION REQUIREMENTS

UNDERGRADUATE STUDIES

Bachelor of Music in Viola Performance:

- One movement of a standard concerto such as Stamitz, Hoffmeister, J.C. Bach, Telemann, or Bartok
- 2. An etude such as Kayser, Kreutzer, or Campagnoli
- Two movements from any of the Six Cello Suites or the Six Sonatas and Partitas by J.S. Bach
- 4. One three-octave major scale and one three-octave minor scale
- 5. One composition should be performed from memory

Bachelor of Music Education in Viola:

- 1. One movement of a standard concerto such as Stamitz, J.C. Bach, or Telemann
- 2. Two movements from any of the Six Cello Suites or the Six Sonatas and Partitas by J.S. Bach
- 3. One three-octave major scale and one three-octave minor scale
- 4. One composition should be performed from memory

Bachelor of Arts in Viola:

- 1. Two contrasting pieces demonstrating ability (*may include etudes*)
- 2. One three-octave major scale and one three-octave minor scale
- 3. One composition should be performed from memory

GRADUATE STUDIES

Master of Arts in Music (Viola)

- One movement of a standard concerto such as Bartok, Stamitz, Walton, or Mozart's Sinfonia Concertante
- 2. Two movements from Nos. 2-6 of the Six Cello Suites, or from any of the Six Sonatas and Partitas, by J.S. Bach
- 3. One three-octave major scale and one three-octave minor scale
- The Bach must be performed from memory; memorization of other works is strongly encouraged
