The mission of the Art History track is to provide students with skills in visual analysis and interpretation, critical thinking and an interdisciplinary and historical understanding of art.

The curriculum provides a foundation for the understanding of art, in all of its various forms, and encourages the development of visual literacy. Contextual, as well as stylistic approaches, provide exposure to different methodologies involved in the study of visual material. A broad range of courses foster critical thinking, multicultural awareness, civic and global responsibility and provide art historical skills that lead to an understanding of image making and the power and function of images.
