Global Learning Outcomes for Music History & Literature

Students will:

- 1. Learn the basic terminology and nomenclature to discuss Western Art Music
 - Understand musical terms and nomenclature when reading about music
 - Use appropriate musical terms and nomenclature when communicating about music to others
- 2. Develop critical listening and thinking skills applicable to all types of music
 - Develop analytical skills to describe music heard and examined in a score
 - Develop synthesis skills to be able to ascribe a given musical work to the appropriate style period, genre, and composer
 - · Learning to think about music aesthetically
- 3. Become familiar with important Western Art Music composers, compositions, and stylistic traits
 - Develop familiarity with distinguishing stylistic features in various musical style periods
 - Develop familiarity with important specific musical compositions and their composers and how those compositions both adhere to and deviate from stylistic norms
- 4. Develop an understanding of Western Art Music's social, political and cultural context
 - Understand how social, political, and cultural events and movements at various times in history affected musicians and their work
 - Understand how the music of various time serves as a commentary upon or reflection of the general social, political, and cultural environment
- 5. Develop research/writing/rhetorical skills to communicate about music knowledgeably and persuasively
 - Use correct citation and bibliography formats based upon Chicago Manual of Style
 - Prepare annotated bibliography using several sources
 - Develop a research abstract
 - Write about music for diverse audiences
